Student Achievement

For the 2019-20 school year, Powdersville High School did not receive a report card rating due to the pandemic; however, we believe we would have received another EXCELLENT rating. Our test scores and graduation rate would continue to "substantially exceed the criteria to ensure all students meet the Profile of the SC Graduate."

Powdersville High again achieved the highest graduation rate in our district, 96.7%. This number means that only two of the over 200 students who entered our school as 9th graders did not complete a high school diploma. As always, we are very proud of our efforts to get EVERY student prepared for life after high school with a diploma.

The 2021 rankings were released, and Powdersville High School was again recognized by US News & World Report as one of the top high schools in the nation and state of South Carolina. We were named the top high school in Anderson School District One by the US News & World Report.

Powdersville High continues to work diligently to complete the school year with as many activities as possible. Prom, Awards Days, and Graduation are all in the works.

Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching

At the start of this school year, Dr. Jenny Van Buren, mathematics teacher at Powdersville High School, was named by the President, as a recipient of the Presidential Awards for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST). She is one of two recipients in the state of South Carolina. Nominations and awards are facilitated by the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) and the National Science Foundation (NSF).

Established in 1983, PAEMST is the highest award given by the U.S. Government to kindergarten through 12th grade teachers of mathematics and science, including computer science.

A panel of distinguished mathematicians, scientists, and educators at the State and National levels assess the applications before recommending nominees to OSTP. Teachers are selected based on their distinction in the classroom and dedication to improving science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) education.
