Student Achievement

For the 2018-19 school year, Powdersville High School received a rating of EXCELLENT on the annual South Carolina School Report Card, acknowledging that our school's performance "substantially exceeds the criteria to ensure all students meet the Profile of the SC Graduate."

Powdersville High again achieved the highest graduation rate in our district, 96.7%. This number means that only two of the over 200 students who entered our school as 9th graders did not complete a high school diploma. As always, we are very proud of our efforts to get EVERY student prepared for life after high school with a diploma.

Powdersville High School was recognized by US News & World Report as one of the top high schools in the Nation. This is the first such recognition since PVHS opened in 2011.

Powdersville High continues to lead Anderson One and continues to rank among the highest in the state on mandated testing such as End of Course Testing, AP, and SAT/ACT.
