The goals listed above are part of our five year improvement plan for 2013-2018.

The Robert Anderson staff will continue to make high student achievement the number one goal for our students.

Highly qualified teachers are a necessity in classrooms and the administration will continue to hire teachers who meet the highly qualified status as determined by the SC State Department guidelines.

Parents are always welcome at Robert Anderson, and the goal is to have more parents involved with volunteer opportunities at the school. Along with Mrs. Dobbins' Sunday call and the school website, our goal is to provide more information about all volunteer opportunities.

Student Achievement

During the 2012-13 school year, the achievement on the PASS tests earned Robert Anderson a grade of "A" from the Federal grading system. PASS scores for 2013 compare favorably with schools like ours. The school averages for students scoring met or above is as follows:

ELA 69.7% Math 74.3% Science 76.5% Social Studies 73.7%

91.1% of Algebra 1 students made a score of 70 or above on the End of Course Test compared to 96.3% of students in schools like ours. 100% of our English 1 students scored 70 or above compared to 95.8% in schools like ours.

76.6% of teachers at Robert Anderson have advanced degrees compared with 58.7% at schools like ours.

Additional Information

During the 2012-2013 school year the Reading Garden that was established in Mrs. Murphy's memory was completed. Students now have a place outside the library to read and enjoy nature. Mrs. Murphy's love of reading will be remembered by students and staff who enjoy the garden. This was a joint effort between the staff and students at Robert Anderson and the Anderson Five District Office.

A 1:1 technology initiative was implemented at Robert Anderson during the 13-14 school year. Every student at Robert Anderson has the use of a Google Chromebook during the school day. As of the third nine weeks, each student is allowed to take the Chromebook home and use it for homework and research.

Robert Anderson remains a National AVID Demonstration School. As a result, all students at the school benefit from AVID strategies. Each student is provided a binder and tabs to assist with organizational skills. Our goal is that all teachers will attend a Summer Institute session the summer after they are hired. 2014-2015 will be our re-designation year.
