The goals listed above are part of our five year improvement plan for 2013-2018.


The Robert Anderson staff will continue to make high student achievement the number one goal for our students.

Additional Information

During the 2017-18, Robert Anderson begin its school year combined with Lakeside Middle School. This merger saw our school population grow from 700 students to 1200 students. We were able to successfully merger and have a fantastic school year. Our demographics are as follows: 46% white, 36% African-American, 11% Hispanic, and 7% other. Over poverty index is at 74% with all of our students receiving Free Breakfast and Lunch under the CDEP program.

Along with high academic expectations, students at Robert Anderson are encouraged to develop an attitude of service to the community. This year the students had many opportunities to assist the Beta Club in activities that included: Alzheimer Memory Walk, PAWS, NHC, Richard Campbell Veterans Home, Anderson Ladies Club, Relay for Life, Centerville Fall Fest, and Water Collection.

Our students also succeeded in athletics and the arts. Both our 7th and 8th grade football teams had a undefeated seasons. We were also able to see our basketball, wrestling, and volleyball teams have a great season. In the areas of the arts, we have several students place in all region in band and strings. There were also many students who had their art pieces recognized by our school and district.
