# **2016-**2017 Year In Review

The 2015-2016 school year has certainly been one to remember! We have had many accomplishments and launched a variety of new initiatives in order to work toward our SIC goals. We launched our school of choice option; Project Based Learning, launched two parenting programs; Watch D.O.G.S. & Parenting Partners, and began utilizing Responsive Classroom to create a strong link between academic success and social-emotional learning.

Every student was given the unique opportunity to investigate and respond to an engaging and complex question, problem, or challenge through the use of our Project Based Learning initiative. A children's lending library was unveiled to school and community members as a result of the Pre-Kindergarten students' study of communities. After talking with local architects and town council members, 4th grade students presented ideas to the Port Royal Town Council to improve the structure of the school building in order to withstand severe weather. These, along with other PBL units, increased collaboration between the school and the community, while giving students the opportunity to learn with real-life experiences.

Our School Improvement Council worked together with school personnel to increase parental involvement by implementing Watch DOGS & Parenting Partners. Watch DOGS encouraged **D**ads Of Great Students to get involved and join us for a full days worth of learning. The Parenting Partners program allowed a group of parents to interact and learn how to best support their child and create success in school and life through a series of 8 weekly workshops. Both programs were successful in building positive relationships between school and home.

The Responsive Classroom approach was embraced by the School Improvement Council in order to foster academic success by providing a high-quality education for students by creating a safe and joyful learning experience. The use of Responsive Classroom strategies each day at Port Royal Elementary includes starting and ending each day with a positive tone for learning and a sense of community, and a shared purpose is developed throughout the school and community, and effective, positive language promotes academic and social growth.
