2014-2015 Year In Review

The 2014-2015 school year is certainly one to remember for the record books! We have had many accomplishments and exciting things happen, including receiving recognition for being named to the National Register of Historic Places, declaring the school of choice option of Project Based Learning, and implementing a school wide recycling program.

We held a Historical Plaque Unveiling Ceremony in December where the plaque recognizing our school for over a century of learning was unveiled with school and district staff members, town hall members, community members, and parents and students were present to share in our major achievement.

Our School Improvement Council worked together with school personnel to declare the school choice option that we will begin offering during the 2015-2016 school year. Our school will provide students with Project Based Learning experiences to help build hands on and critical thinking skills while learning grade level specific content curriculum.

Our class of 3rd grade students kicked off our first major Project Based Learning experience by developing a school wide recycling program through their unit of study on the environment. It all started with a single question: If recycling is so good for the environment, how come we don't do it at school? This led the way for an enthusiastic group of students to educate the whole school population on the importance of recycling, and even organize a community wide clean up of our school campus, and the surrounding neighborhood.
