# 2020-2021 Year in Review

This school year has certainly been a challenging one for all. We got off to a late start due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Students began a full virtual model of instruction on September 8, 2020. ZOOM became the new buzz word as everyone had to find links to the Zoom Video Conference platform to interact with teachers and students. Teachers creatively found ways to deliver instruction online through zoom and learning platforms such as Google Classroom (grades 3-5) and SeeSawI(K-2). In October, families were given options to choose a hybrid model where students attended in person instruction for two days of the week. On the other days students accessed their learning online. Safety protocols were expected by staff and students including: face masks, temperature checks, social distancing, and frequent hand washing & hand sanitizer. Finally, in January of 2021, we offered a full week of in person instruction for any students who wanted to come back to the school building while others remained in a virtual model. Teachers began 'synchronous teaching' so that students at home could participate with their homeroom instruction simultaneously. In April of 2020, more than 85% of our students had returned to in person learning on campus.

Despite all of the awkward transitions, we worked to give students some of the traditional experiences with a twist. Our families participated in a virtual MATH Night via zoom. Students played games with their families, teachers, and classmates. In March we celebrated Read Across Port Royal Week with a variety of activities to promote the love of reading. Students dressed up as favorite book characters, participated in a break out challenge, and read nonfiction texts to learn about different countries. Families were invited to 'drive thru' one evening to the different 'countries' while picking up books and activities to do at home.

Every month students gathered 'virtually' for our CREW Rally where we celebrated how students earned points for his/her crew by meeting behavior expectations. Each month the winning Crew was announced. We also cheered on the Mariners of the Month from each homeroom that were selected by exhibiting positive character traits.
