2017-2018 Year In Review

The 2017-2018 school year has certainly been an exciting one to remember! We have had many accomplishments and have a continued focus on our school initiatives, that ultimately support us in reaching our SIC goals. Our school of choice option; Project Based Learning, along with our targeted male role model and mentoring program; Watch D.O.G.S. and our schoolwide Responsive Classroom approach is helping to nurture the strong link between academic success and social-emotional learning we fully invest in here at Port Royal Elementary School.

Continuing this year, every student has the unique opportunity to investigate and respond to an engaging and complex question, problem, or challenge through the use of our Project Based Learning initiative. Pre-kindergarten and 2nd grade students investigated the amount of trash and litter found on our school campus and organized a community wide clean-up. Kindergarten students recognized the need for additional plants that attracted butterflies on our campus to help equip the environment with a continued source of pollination. First graders began the study of composting in their classrooms, with hopes to be able to provide additional soil to newly planted areas on our campus. While 4th and 5th graders began extensive research about the depletion of oysters as natural resources and will begin educating our community about the benefits of recycling oyster shells and restoring local oyster reefs. Through our environmentally focused project units this year, our students have earned their EPA badges and are recognized as Environmental Protection Agents! Because of our hard work, our school has also applied to be recognized as a South Carolina Green Steps School and are awaiting our notification of acceptance.

These PBL units, continue to increase collaboration between the school and the community, while also giving students the opportunity to learn with real-life experiences.

Our School Improvement Council worked together with school personnel to increase parental involvement and to provide a safe and joyful learning environment to promote academic and social growth.
