

- provided academic our RISE enrichment with Intervention groups, as well as our IStation Reading Program.






- All students were inspired by our Black History Month keynote speaker, WNBA star and York native, Ivory Latta. Our second graders led a Black History Month research showcase.

Our school counselor developed a birthday book program to




provide the gift of a book to each student on his/her birthday.
