



## Highlights of 2017-2018:

- \* We provided academic enrichment for targeted students with our reading interventionist, as well as our Academy of Reading and Academy of Math Programs.
- \* We partnered with Boys & Girls Clubs of York County to provide homework help and after school care to 75 students.
- Our student council planned service projects for our local community, such as a canned food drive and a pet supply collection for a local animal rescue center.
- \* Students may participate in a variety of clubs and activities: JAM'N, Performing Arts Club, STEP Team, Girls on the Run, Archery, and more. Over 200 people visited our HCJ Arts Showcase.
- \* For our "One Grade, One Book, One History" initiative, each grade level selected a text to read and study during our Black History Month schoolwide inquiry. A grant from York Electric Cooperative provided copies of the selected texts. A student-led Black History Month assembly allowed students to showcase their learning.
- \* After completing a book study, all teachers incorporated inquiry circles in their classrooms. Students showcased their learning through the use of technology.
- Students attended a Career Fair with over 20 different presenters.



- Our students raised over \$4333.21 for Jump Rope for Heart and pledged to be healthy with our 5-3-2-1-0 Challenge.
