### Highlights of 2016-2017:

We provided academic enrichment for targeted students with the addition of a reading interventionist, as well as our Academy of Reading, Academy of Math and Code Explode the programs.



- We provided academic assistance for our ESOL students in our ESOL After-School Program.
- We partnered with Boys & Girls Clubs of York County to provide homework help and after school care to 75 students.
- Our student council planned service projects for our local community, such as a canned food drive and a "Soaps for Seniors" collection for our local nursing home.
- Our "audition based" after school performing arts club, JAM'N, rehearsed and performed two original musical productions.
- Over 200 people visited our HCJ Arts Showcase.
- Our One Book/One School initiative cultivated a love for reading through trivia games, prizes and a school-wide assembly. A grant from York Electric Cooperative provided each student and faculty member with a personal copy of the book, The World According to Humphrey.
- Students attended a Career Fair with over 20 different presenters.

- Our students raised over \$4333.21 for Jump Rope for Heart and pledged to be healthy with our 5-3-2-1-0 Challenge.
- Our morning news crew learned about telecommunications as they wrote, directed and produced our news show. The students toured the



mass communications department and newsroom at Winthrop University.

- Our Student of the Month recognition program recognized 185 different students for their classroom achievements.
- Our "Fall for Reading Night," sponsored by Bank of York the HCJ PTO, provided free, fall fun for our students and their families... as well as a free book for each student in our school.



Our Read Across America and Black History Month celebrations culminated in a school wide assembly. Kim Johnson, author of No Fear For Freedom: The Story of the Friendship Nine, co-hosted the assembly which included an interactive reading bowl challenge and a performance by the York Comprehensive High School Women's Ensemble.
