

\* Students participated in clubs such as: 4th Grade Performing Arts Club, STEP Team, and Girls on the Run.




- \* All students were inspired by our Black History Month keynote speaker, WNBA star and York native, Ivory Latta. Our second graders led a Black History Month research showcase.

Our morning news crew learned about telecommunications as they wrote, directed and produced our news show. The students toured the mass communications department and newsroom at Winthrop University.




- Our Student of the Month recognition program recognized
