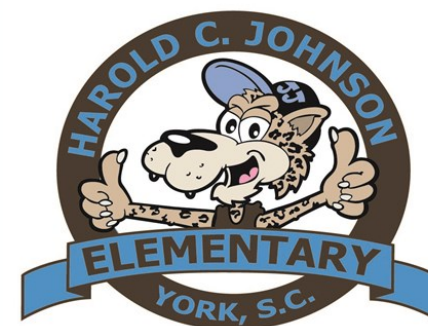

## Highlights of 2021-2022:

\* The COVID 19 pandemic overshadowed much of the first three quarters of the school year. We returned to normal operating procedures on March 1, 2022.

\* We provided academic enrichment with our RISE intervention program and Behavior Intervention using the Zones of Regulation.



\* We partnered with Boys & Girls Clubs of York County to provide homework help and after school care to students at no cost to parents.

\* We maintained our One-to-One status with Chromebooks for each student in third and fourth grade.

\* All students were inspired by our virtual Veterans Day and Black History Month programs. Each classroom participated in our Black History Month research showcase.

\* All teachers and administrators participated in Professional Development on conferring with students, the workshop model, Blended Learning, Lucy Calkins Units of Study in Phonics, alignment of standards across grade levels in math, mental health, and social/emotional learning.



\* We were voted *Hula Frog's Most Loved Elementary School* in York County for 2022. We have received this award three times in the past four years.



\* Our Student of the Month recognition program recognized 185 different students for their classroom achievements.

\* Our "Fall for Reading" celebration, sponsored by the HCL PTO, provided free, fall fun for our students as well as a free book for each student in our school.



\* Our testing pep rally encouraged students to try their best on their important end of year tests.

\* We implemented our new SEL program called Panorama.

\* Our school-wide house system increased school unity and encouraged relationships among students and staff from all across the school.

\* Our school counselor continued our birthday book program to provide the gift of a book to each student on his/her birthday.
