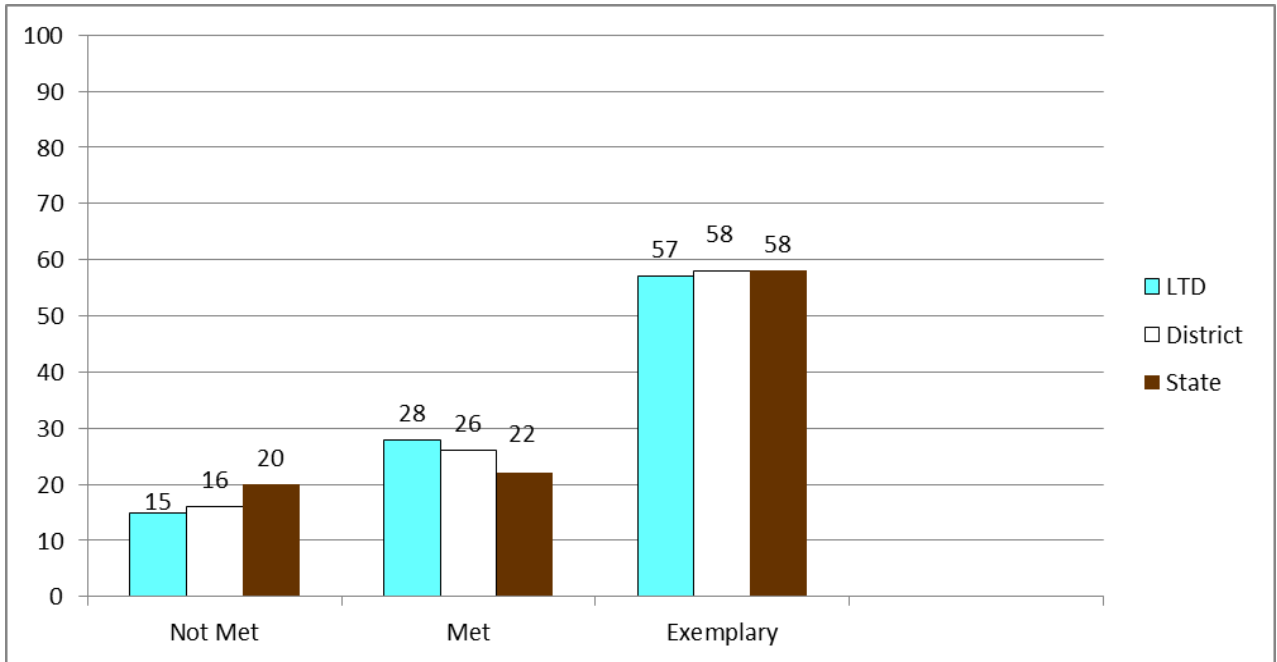

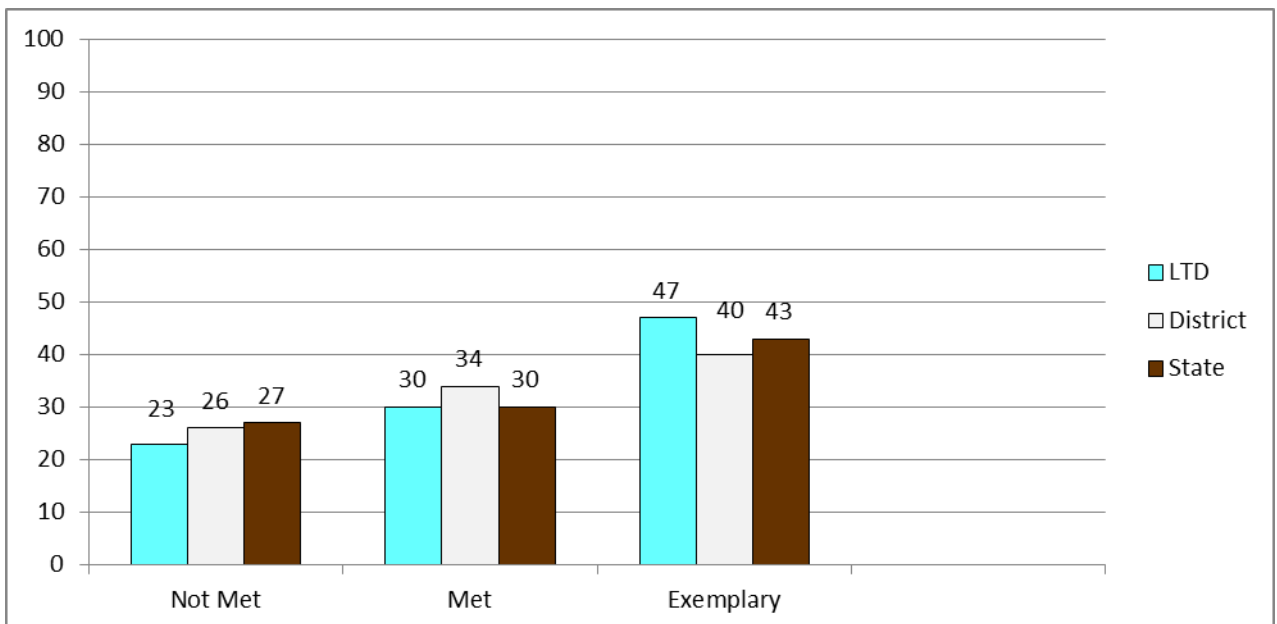
Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) Test

ENGLISH/LANGUAGE ARTS GRADE 3



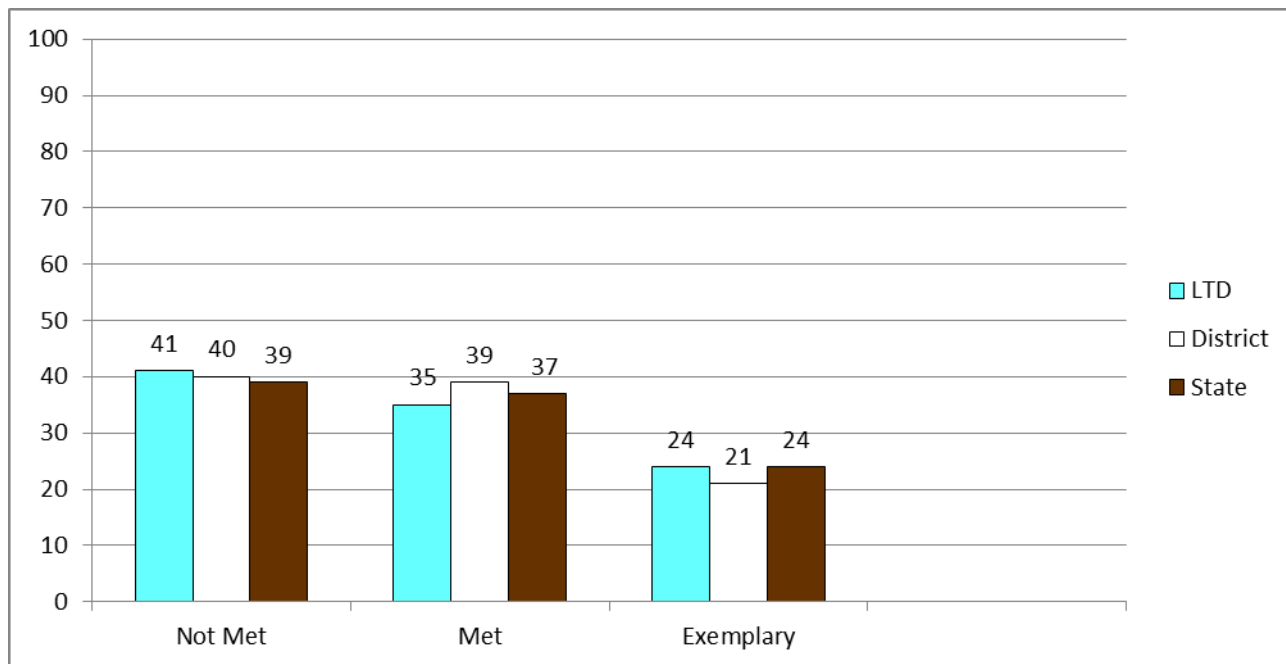
MATHEMATICS GRADE 3



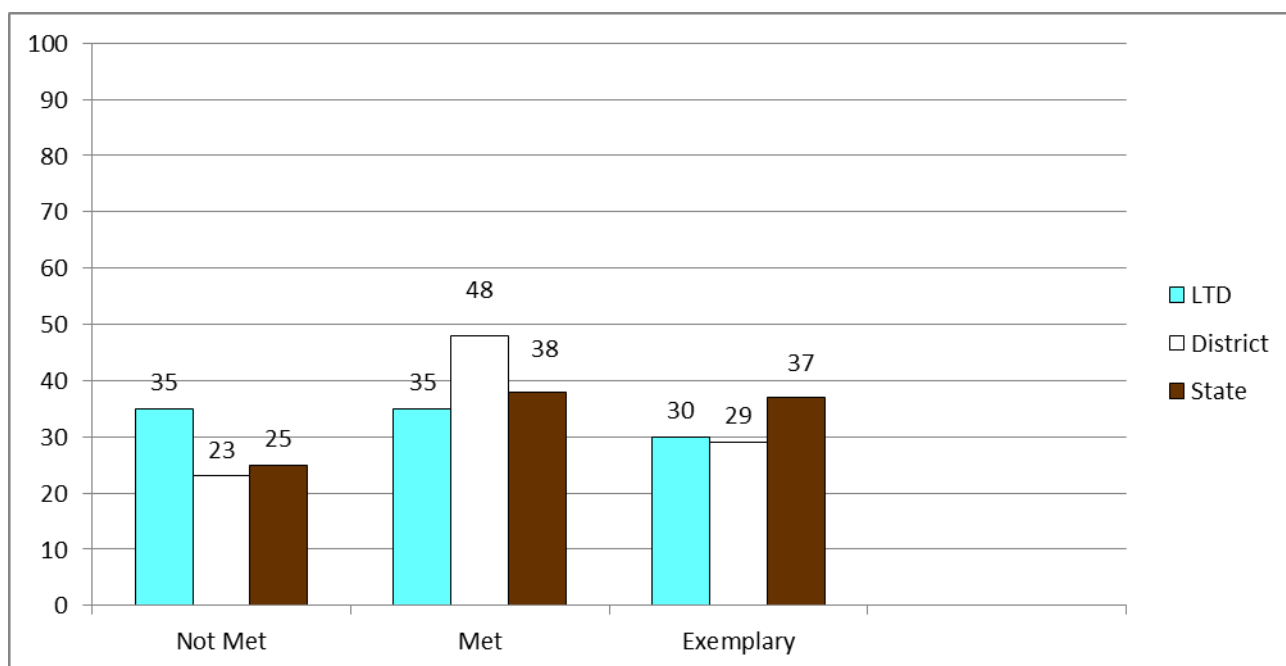


Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS) Test Lucy T. Davis Elementary School Student Achievement Spring 2012 in comparison to District and State

Strategies for Improving Instruction at Lucy T. Davis Elementary

2012-2013

1. Lucy T. Davis follows the Florence School District One Curriculum Alignment Document where instruction is correlated to Common Core and state standards in all subjects, and assessments match instruction.
2. Long-range plans and weekly lesson plans are correlated to the Curriculum Alignment Document.
3. Teacher-made tests are used to assess weekly skills. Throughout the year student achievement is measured by STAR testing and Dominie.
4. Benchmark tests cover Common Core and state standards for all subjects and are administered each quarter.
5. MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) tests are administered in the fall and spring to determine a student's academic achievement and growth from fall to spring and year to year.
6. Compass Learning-Odyssey, a computer based program, is used in conjunction with MAP to provide engaging activities for individual learning styles and achievement levels.
7. *Thinking Maps*, a thought organizing program, is used school-wide in grades K-4.
8. "Literacy Lab" is offered in first grade to provide reading strategies for all levels.
9. A variety of resources are used to engage students in all subjects: software programs, internet resources, computer lab activities, laptops, Ipads, Ipods, SMARTBoards, Smart Response System, and United Streaming.
10. Supplemental materials have been purchased to prepare students for the PASS test that is administered in the spring: PASS Coach and Flash Masters.
11. Inquiry based math lessons are taught in all grades.
12. The staff continues to upgrade their skills in technological advancements to better serve their students.
13. Remedial and hands on instruction is provided by instructional assistants, a science lab teacher, and classroom teachers during and after school for grades K-4.
14. Enrichment programs are provided by parents, staff, and community members: ScienceSouth, School Clubs, Mad Science, and Academic Nights.
15. Technology, reading, writing, math, science, homework, and discipline workshops are provided for parents and teachers.
16. Standards-based workshops are offered throughout the year, assisting teachers in providing enrichment to use with the current curriculum.
17. Parent/Teacher Conferences are held to discuss students' progress.
18. The Lucy T. Davis Administrative Team monitors instruction and assessment.
