

EL Education

EL Education is modeled to challenge students to think critically and take active roles in their classrooms and communities. An EL school aligns curriculum, instruction, assessment, culture and character, and leadership into a cohesive, clear vision for student learning.

STEM Education

Using a variety of activity-based learning models, students are provided science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) opportunities to foster reasoning and critical thinking skills, creativity, and innovation.

Service Learning

In every Expedition, there is a service learning component. This year, sixth grade focused on Special Olympics. They used the design process to create prototypes of adaptable solutions to games competed in during Special Olympics events. Seventh grade students learned about the water crisis in South Sudan. They raised money and planned a 5k to sponsor the building of a well in South Sudan.

World Language

World Languages are an important part of the curriculum at MGM. Students experience language learning through performance-based tasks and assessments. We offer Spanish, French, Latin and Chinese (Mandarin).
