Expeditionary Learning

Projects are a core structure for the learning of content and key skills in an Expeditionary Learning school. Expeditionary Learning uses research, fieldwork, experts, and reading and writing to produce quality work. Expeditions came to life this year in our 8th grade Loving Lexington Expedition where students were tasked to improve quality of life in Lexington. All students researched, developed and presented a professional proposal to the public. Select groups also presented to the Darla Moore School of Business, Lexington Town Council, and Lexington Chamber of Commerce.

STEM Education

Using a variety of activity-based learning models, students are provided science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) opportunities to foster reasoning and critical thinking skills, creativity and innovation.
