#### Habits of Scholarship

Meadow Glen Middle School implemented the Habits of Scholarship report card. The Habits of Scholarship include communicating clearly and appropriately, listening to and respecting the perspectives of others, revising work for quality and persevering until successful, collaborating with others, and completing tasks and assignments on time.

#### **Town Hall Meetings/ Student Leadership**

At MGM, you do not have to have a title to be a leader. Students have the privilege of leading town hall meetings for their grade levels. At these meetings, birthdays are announced, student learning is highlighted, and student accomplishments are celebrated. Students also plan for and lead pep rallies.

### **Citizen Scholars**

We celebrate students who consistently show respect for others, are polite, make good choices, produce quality work, and take advantage of academic opportunities. These citizen scholars are announced monthly at town hall meetings.

#### **MGM Gator Apprentice**

Eighth-grade iCivics students are offered an authentic learning experience in applying and interviewing for a job at Chick-fil-A. The winner is offered a part-time position at the Chick-fil-A Saluda Pointe location upon turning 15 years of age.





# **Expeditionary Learning (EL)**

EL is modeled to challenge students to think critically and take active roles in their classrooms and communities. An EL school aligns curriculum instruction, assessment, culture and character, and leadership into a cohesive, clear vision for student learning. One expedition conducted by our students was entitled, "The Choice to Serve." Seventh grade students interviewed 75+ local veterans and created e-book documentaries highlighting their stories.

## **STEM Education**

Students were able to get hands-on experiences with a variety of activity-based learning models, such as 3D printing, coding, and game development. They also learned the benefits of recycling through the Global Cardboard Challenge. Experts shared their knowledge of engineering and careers, including one engineer who is responsible for developing the code that is used for in-

flight simulators.



#### World Languages

World languages are part of the core curriculum at MGMS. Students experience language learning through performancebased tasks and assessments. They also participate in activities focused on culture and service, such as the Pulsera Project and Saucisses pour Senegal. Students raised funds and increased awareness for empowering communities, student scholarships, and creating jobs in Nicaragua and Senegal.

We offer Spanish, French, Latin, and Chinese (Mandarin).

#### Girls on Track and Run Hard

Each club inspires students to be healthy and confident using a fun, experience-based curriculum which creatively integrates running. Both clubs equip students to run a 5k race.

### **Healthy Nutrition**

Our Gator Grill offers two fruits and two vegetables every day during lunch. Two different S.C. grown fruits and vegetables are featured each month. Students are also offered lots of whole grains, fat-free skim milk, 1% white milk, and fat-free flavored milks.

### Recycling

iCivics classes have implemented a school-wide recycling initiative. Through the Department of Health and Environmental Control, we are working to become a *Green Steps School*.
