

## General Information

North Pointe Elementary School is located on Highway 81 North, approximately 3 miles from the city limits of Anderson, South Carolina. Built in 2012, North Pointe is a two story facility with 134,038 square feet sitting on almost 37 acres. North Pointe houses 41 regular sized classrooms, 12 tutorial spaces, 1 science lab, a full size auditorium, gymnasium, cafeteria and a Learning Commons. 2020-2021 student enrollment includes over 547 4K-5th grade students. North Pointe's two CERDEP (Child Early Reading Development Education Program) classrooms serve students in the Midway Elementary and North Pointe Elementary attendance zones. The school hosts twenty-seven classrooms from K4 through fifth grade. There are 2 self-contained behavior support classrooms with 2 certified teachers and 2 teaching assistants. These classrooms are also supported with a full-time mental health counselor and a sensory room. North Pointe's Parent Teacher Organization plays an integral role in supporting school initiatives. This is evident through annual fundraisers, providing teachers with classroom supply funds, creating magical family events throughout the school year, and so much more.
