
PAWS Behavior Incentive Program

Focused School Renewal Goals

Goal 1: By May 2, 2012 the number of students scoring met or exemplary in ELA will increase by 10%. This will result in a reduction in the number of students who are not met to 42.3% or below in grade 7 and 42.5% or below in grade 8. Measurement will use current PASS correlations.

Goal 2: By May 2, 2012 the number of students scoring met or exemplary in Math will increase by 10%. This will result in a reduction in the number of students who are not met to 39.2% or below in grade 7 and 23.5% or below in grade 8. Measurement will use current PASS correlations.

Administrators and teachers will:

- Align instruction to the state standards.
- Participate in and implement research-based staff development to improve teaching practices.
- Use books for reading that are matched to students' independent reading levels.
- Implement a rewards-based plan for improving academic achievement, student attendance, and student behavior.
- Provide an environment conducive to learning.
- Implement the middle school concept to include teaming.
- Analyze test data from PASS, SRI, and MAP testing to guide the instruction of students.
- Create opportunities for parents to become familiar with the school setting, become knowledgeable about school programs, and be active participants in their child's academic career.
- Target students who are within a ten point range of a scoring category on PASS for specialized instruction across the curriculum.

- Increase student achievement.
- Focus on literacy for all students.
- Utilize collaborative planning teams to explore research-based strategies, plan for instruction, and meet the needs of all learners.
- Increase opportunities for parents and community stakeholders to actively participate in plans to meet school goals.
