

Focused School Renewal Goals

Goal 1: By the end of the school year, the number of students scoring met or exemplary in ELA will increase by 10%. This will result in an increase in the number of students who are met or exemplary to 76.5% in sixth grade, 63.5% in seventh grade and 69.6% in the eighth grade.
