2023-2024 SIC Overview

The School Improvement Council serves the school principal and faculty in an advisory role, bringing together parents, educators, students, and community stakeholders to collaborate on the improvement of their school.

This year, the RBHS SIC convened to collaborate on school improvement needs related to RBHS work plan goals and district implementations.

23-24 RBHS school goals included:
