# North Charleston Creative Arts: Points of Pride

In our first year as a school, we are in the process of completing the Distinguished Arts Program Grant. **Distinguished Arts Progam Grant (DAP)** is used to develop and implement arts initiatives that support quality arts education programs that significantly improve student achievement in the arts. This grant will fund the visitation of our staff to conferences, as well as professional development in the arts-infusion curriculum. North Charleston Creative Arts received a grant from the Youth Endowment of the Arts for the purchase of equipment for the start-up of our violin program

Charleston Stage joined our children in March for a week with four professional actors to work with first graders on creating a presentation of a German folktale, PIED PIPER OF HAMELIN for a PTA event in March. This artist in residency was also sponsored through a grant by Youth Endowment for the Arts.
