A Note from the SIC Chair:

Dr. Phinnize J. Fisher Middle School has had an exceptional sixth year! This year we implemented several changes to meet the unique needs of our students. One was to move from an A/B block schedule to a seven period schedule. As a result students could be placed into teams so they would have the same peer group and teachers for all of their core academic classes. This allowed for common planning time for teachers to work together to more effectively support student needs academically as well as from a social and emotional standpoint. To further meet the social and emotional needs of students an advisory period was added and the 7 Mindsets program was adopted. Fisher also started implementation of Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (PBIS).

Our School Improvement Council, also in its sixth year, is a representative group of parents, teachers, administrators, and business/community members. It has become an effective, collaborative group whose objectives are to establish, monitor, and evaluate school site goals designed for ongoing school improvement.

We are all very proud of the Excellent rating that Fisher Middle earned on our state report card. As we continue to move ahead, we will build on our successes, continuing to create a unique and inspiring environment for our students.
