
UPCOMING EVENTS:


STUDENT LEARNING AND ACHIEVEMENT

Performance: We have seen a steady increase in both goals in this area over the past five years.

GOAL 1: 77% of 4K students in the Child Development Centers will be able to demonstrate one to one correspondence using a set of 10.

QUALITY PERSONNEL


Performance: Our staff has participated in a wide variety of professional learning over the past five years to address these goals.
