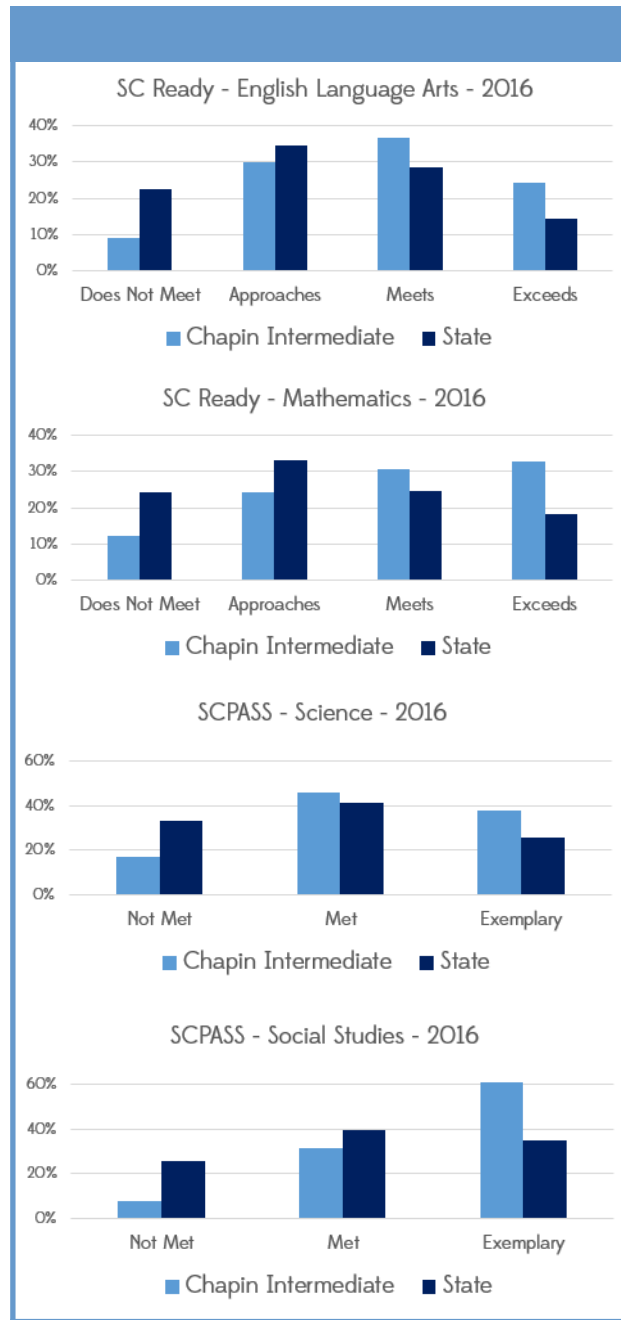
SIC Annual Goals

Students completed more than 9,000 acts of kindness and raised more than \$5,000 for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society during the Great Kindness Challenge.

712 books were collected by our school and donated to The Hub, a community-supported after school program that provides tutoring, snacks, and meals.

Student leaders organized a canned food drive with our guidance department and collected 2,142 non-perishable items for the We Care Center, a local organization that supports families in need.

Our recess area was redesigned by student leaders and administration in order to create a more fun and age-appropriate space, including games and spaces designed to encourage activity.

Visual Arts and Technology students created greeting cards and provided them to members of our military who pass through our local USO station.

Our school earned numerous grants for various projects including a shade structure and new games for our recess area, recycling and composting, and classroom-specific projects.

The CIS-SIC was named to the Honor Roll for the SC-SIC Dick and Tunky Riley Award for SIC Excellence.
