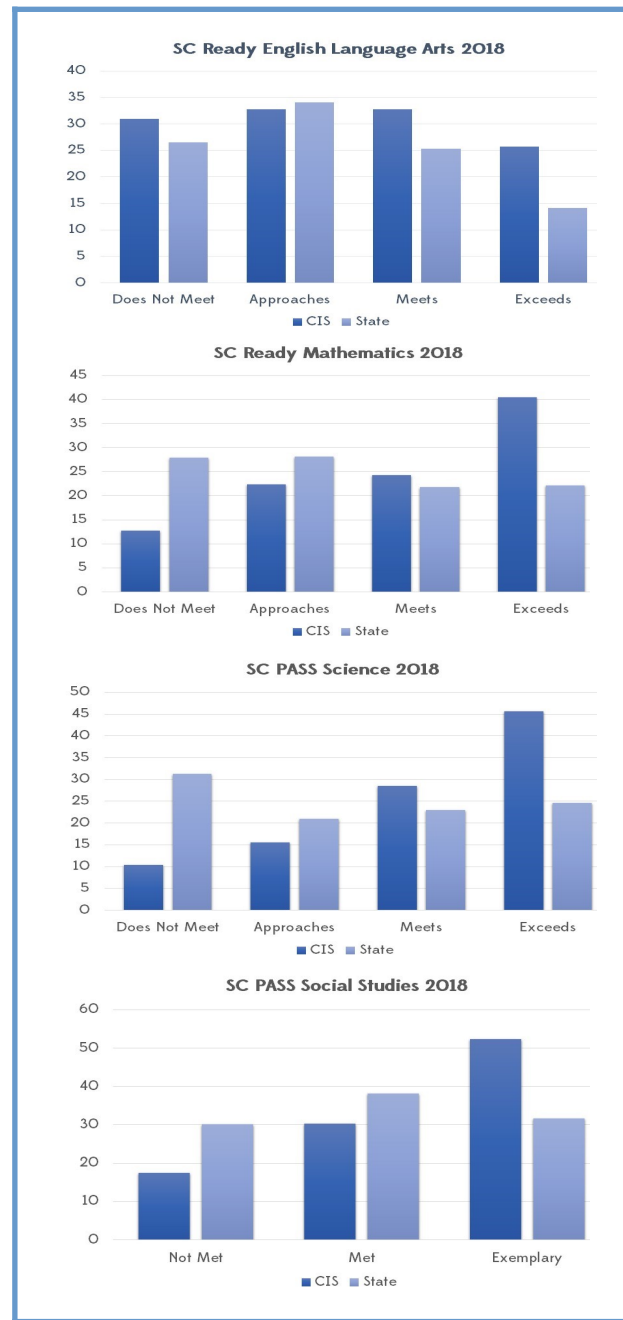
## SIC Annual Goals
