- 63 Seniors qualify for "Distinguished Diploma" based on a county point system using grades in honors, AP and Dual Enrollment coursework.
- 30 Seniors qualify for "AP Scholar" based on a score of 3 or better on 3 AP Examinations.
- 59 Seniors qualify as "Stem Scholars" based on a point system in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics grades in these courses.
- 146 Seniors qualify as "CATE Completers" based on completion of a Career and Technology pathway of courses.
- 31 Seniors qualify as "Senior Scholars" based on being in the top 10 percent of the class and a minimum grade of a "B" in every course taken and at the quarter and final score grading opportunity.
