MAYRIVER HIGH TESTING DATA



The first semester failure rate for MRHS was 3.4%, reflecting 166 failures of 4872 courses taken.

The first semester End of Course scores improved from our first year and are as follows: Algebra was second (2nd) in the district for the school pass rate and 1.3% above the district average. In English I, our school ranked second (2nd) and was 3.2% above the district average. In US History, the school was again first (1st) in the district and was 9.3% above the district average. In Biology, the school improved from fourth (4th) last year to first (1st) in the district this year with 12.4% above the district average.

Our Advanced Placement scores finished with a 54% passing rate during the 2016-2017 school year and we expect to surpass that this year.

May River High School ACT scores surpassed the district and state average in every content area in the first year.

School Improvement Council Bylaws

Article 1-Name of Organization

The name of the organization will be the May River High School Improvement Council.

Article 2-Purpose

The purpose of the May River High School Improvement Council will be to:

- Assist in the development, implementation, and evaluation of the five-year school improvement plan (also known as the school renewal plan or strategic plan);
- Assist in the preparation of yearly plan updates;
- Write the annual Report to Parents, which provides information on the school's progress in meeting school and district goals and objectives, due for distribution by April 30;
- Prepare the annual narrative for the School Report Card, in conjunction with the principal;
- Provide advice on the use of school incentive award expenditures (if allocated by the legislature and awarded to the school);
- Participate in the revision of the School Improvement Plan if the school is rated "Unsatisfactory" on the School Report Card;
- Serve as liaison between the school, school organizations, the community and the local school board by collecting and disseminating pertinent information; and
- Provide other assistance that the principal may request as well as carrying out any other duties prescribed by the local school board.

The council will not have the powers and duties reserved by law or regulation to the local school board.

Article 3-Representation and Membership

A minimum of three parents of current students in the school will be elected by the parents.

A minimum of two teachers will be elected by the teachers assigned to the school A minimum of two students per grade level will be elected by students enrolled in the school.

Representatives from the greater school community will be appointed by the principal. The appointments will be made from the non-parent portion of the community with attention to the representation on the council in terms of race, sex, geography, grade level representation, or other variables important to the school.

Student Improvement Council (SIC)

Purpose: This report is issued by the May River High School Improvement Council in accordance with the South Carolina law. Its purpose is to share information on the school's progress in meeting various goals and objectives, the work of the SIC, and other accomplishments throughout the school year.
