Social Studies— 75.3% scored Met or Exemplary

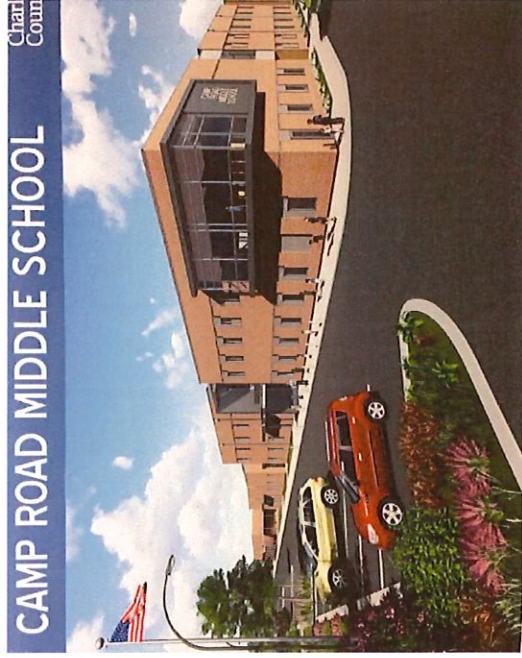
