We are committed to advancing high academic achievement, building the character skills that benefit academic and life preparation, and supporting the health and wellness of our students. We are dedicated to developing partnerships with families and the community that serve the educational needs of our students. Our students think deeply, live zestfully, act gratefully, care empathetically, work with grit, and lead with confidence and humility.

2017-2018 School Goals

During this school year, MSEB has been focused on two large goals: increasing English Language Arts skills and increasing positive school culture and individual student behavior.

English Language Arts Goals

- 85% of students make typical growth on MAP Reading
- 70% of students make tiered growth on MAP Reading
- 50% of students score above the 75th percentile on MAP Reading and 75% of students score above the 50th percentile
- 75% of 3rd & 4th grade students score “meets” or “exceeds” on SC Ready ELA
- 85% of students are on or above grade level on STEP

School Culture Goals

- Less than 10% of our students will serve an out-of-school suspension
- Less than 25% of our students will have a behavior referral
- Less than 5% of our students will have more than 10 behavioral referrals
- 100% of students on Tier III behavior plans improve behavior over time
- 100% of teachers use the MSEB behavior management system and have a calm, positive, rigorous classroom climate

2017-2018 School Highlights

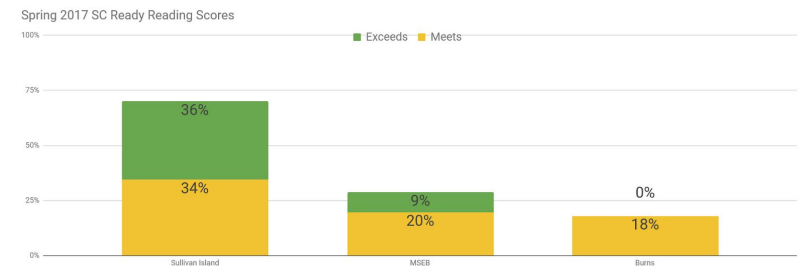
This school year, we have experienced many firsts and many exciting events. We...
