

Literacy/Math at BLES/ECC

The SERG Star Reader's Challenge, a fun program with prizes including gift cards to restaurants and activities all around Bluffton and HHI. We also continued our Webster's Challenge this year, in which grade level classes compete to read the most minutes at home. We will end the year in a partnership with Beaufort County Public Libraries to offer a summer reading game with fantastic prizes.

We have continued our work with our core literacy program, Scholastic Literacy, supported by small group instruction and word work for maximum impact on student proficiency in reading. This year, in grades 3-5, we have emphasized Text Dependent Analysis, a section of the SC Ready Assessment, in which students examine a highly complex text then write to analyze the author's craft. The students continue to impress us as they grow increasingly proficient in this high-level, rigorous task.

We were able to continue offering additional reading support to many third graders after school. During tutoring, students read high-quality literature, write in response to reading, and engage in phonics and word study.

We have thoroughly enjoyed our literacy work with your children! Thank you for your support at home and please keep reading with your child every night!

Math—It has been a wonderful year at BLES! In mathematics, we continue to use *Ready Classroom Mathematics* as our primary math program. This program is focused on teaching mathematics through problem-solving. This focus helps students see that math is relevant and is used regularly in our daily lives. The math program is also supported through an online platform. Students take an assessment 3 times each year on this platform. The student results on these assessments creates an individual learning path which helps to support students in their math instruction, whether they need extra practice with certain skills or need to extend their learning beyond grade level standards. To see the greatest benefit from the program, the students participate for 45 minutes each week and pass 1-2 lessons weekly.

Additionally, our teachers focus on building mathematical understanding, not teaching math skills by following a procedure. By building this understanding, students will know when to use the skills they learn, and it leads to more success in middle and high school mathematics. Teachers also meet students' needs through small group instruction which allows teachers to fill gaps in instruction or extend learning for those students who have already mastered a particular math skill.

Also, this year we were so excited to have 2 tutors during the school day. These tutors worked with students in grades 3-5 to provide additional practice and/or instruction to help close some gaps due to the learning loss during the COVID-19 pandemic. We also continued with after-school tutoring for 3rd grade students who needed more support in math.

Students and teachers have worked extremely hard this year and students have shown great growth in mathematics! We encourage families to look for math in the many places you go this summer and the activities in which you participate!

This school year (2022-2023) was fun and exciting for our board as we had new members join and were able to help make up for the last couple of years when Covid hit and really put a damper on how we were able to fundraise and provide items needed/wanted for the school.
