Accomplishments

The **Drama Club** had a great year! They won Best Play, Best Actor (Alonzo Hay), and Best Director (Samantha Cartin) for their Garcia Theater Festival production of "The Phony Physician." Acting medals were also awarded to Lessie Day and Elora Yochum. In December, the group staged the play, The Diary of Anne Frank. Mrs. Judith Evans, a Holocaust survivor, spoke at the Drama Club's dinner theater on December 5, 2015. The Drama Club performed one scene of the play at the Adath Yeshurun synagogue's annual Hanukkah party.

The NJROTC Orienteering Team placed 5th at the Navy National Orienteering Championships in Tacoma, Washington. The Rifle Team placed 12th at the Area Six Championships (2-states: North and South Carolina) Rifle Championships (2-states: North and South Carolina) pionship in Lexington, SC. Academic Team placed 3rd in the Brunswick Invitational meet and the Cyber Team continues its march toward the National Championship and the Palmetto Cyber Defense Competition.
