## Club Accomplishments

The **Drama Club** won Best Play at the 2013 Garcia Festival for *The Boor*. They also won Best Set and Best Actress. The drama club presented a full-length drama in December 2013, *And Then There Were None* by Agatha Christie.

The **South Aiken DECA Chapter** had 22 students win awards at the state competition with 10 first place winners and 17 qualifying to attend the International competition. Kaitlyn Laird and Amy Hayden were elected to serve as new state officers. Outgoing state president Lauren Scott won the SC DECA state scholarship award as the top state DECA member. Lauren also won the National DECA Emerging Leader Award and a \$2000 National DECA scholarship.

The **NJROTC Orienteering** placed fourth at the National Orienteering Competition. The **NJROTC CyberPatriot Team** was the Southeast Region champions.

The **Mu Alpha Theta (Math Honor Society)** won the Mandelbrot Math Challenge, the USC math meet, and the College of Charleston math meet in multiple events including sprint, physics, marathon, and written test. The calculus team won the Clemson Calculus Challenge three years in a row. The president-elect, David Stoner, was on last year's USA national team that placed first in the Masters of Mathematics in Romania; he is still in the testing stages for the IMO this year.

The **Boys' Golf Team** were 2013 4A State Champions.

The **SAHS Band** had 17 students selected to participate in the Region 2 Honor Band. The band received a Superior rating at the USC-Aiken Concert Band Festival and the 2014 State Concert Band Festival.

The **FFCLA** had three Gold Medal Award winners at the State Culinary Arts Competition; the winners were Parshaad Reed, Edward Pajerski, Nicholas Sasso.

The **South Aiken Thoroughbred Choral** earned an Excellent rating at South Carolina State Choral Festival.

The **Girl's Golf Team** finished sixth in the state and had three All-Region members.

The **FBLA** had a First Place winner and two Second Place winners at the FBLA State Conference. Devang Patel placed first in computer applications, and Zachary Markiewicz along with Kris Byrne placed second in management information systems.

The **Academic Team** won Third Place in the state championship. They also won the county championship for the fourth year in a row.

There are 12 teachers at SAHS with **National Board Certification**. Our faculty members are rated *Highly Qualified* by the SC State Department of Education to teach their subjects.
