### **Innovative Learning & Resources**

Artsonia – Coosa student artwork is displayed online in a Student Art Gallerv at artsonia.com. Fall 2011 and Fall 2012 - Coosa Art Teacher Donna Sams received Artsonia's Annual Leadership Award, an honor extended to only 10 teachers from each state. In 2011, Coosa's online art gallery was ranked 9th in the state. In 2012. Coosa was ranked 6th in the state.

Before-School Early Drop-Off program (6:30 - 7:30 am) is available for a nominal fee and includes developmental activities such as chess, checkers, puzzles, LEGOS, and other cooperative dames.

Brain Boosters - A 2nd grade curriculum resource that encourages critical thinking and problem solving.

Department of Defense Grant (2011-2014) - a targeted 3-year initiative that focuses on advancing student achievement in literacv and math by providing:

- STEM (Science/Technology/ Engineering/Math) infused with literacy and leadership
- Experiential learning using technology to create models and representations (LEGOS, robotics, and animation) of mathematical ideas

#### Early morning (Sunrise) Programs, such as:

- Compass Learning and Waterford Learning for students scoring in the lower quartile on MAP

Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) - Classes designed to challenge gualifying 3rd and 4th grade students.

Instructional Coaches-Reading and math coaches focus on teacher professional development and teaching "best practices". Literacy Intervention Teachers and Math Tutors—Certified teachers provide intensive small group and individual reading or math instruction for struggling students.
