Coosa Elementary School was built in 1998 and was named after the Coosa Indians who once populated this area. There are many spellings for this now extinct tribe, but the one we chose was Coosa (pronounced coo saw).

The bobcat is our school mascot, the only native wild cat found in South Carolina today. The bobcat gets it's name from its short (bobbed) tail.
