STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT RESULTS AND GOALS

- By 2022, the percent of students in Kindergarten meeting or exceeding DRA2 end-of-year target score will increase from 77.3% to at least 79.0%.
- The percent of 1st and 2nd grade students scoring at or above the 40th National Percentile Rank (NPR) as measured by STAR will increase from 60.7% to at least 75.0%.
- The percent of students in grades 3-5 scoring at or above the Meets Expectations level on the SC Ready ELA assessment will increase from 42.8% to at least 50.0%.
- By 2022, the percent of 1st and 2nd grade students scoring at or above the 40th NPR in Math as measured by spring STAR will increase from 69.25% to at least 75.0%.
- The percent of students in grades 3-5 scoring at or above the Meets Expectations on the SC Ready Math assessment will increase from 48.1% to at least 53.0%.

LEARNING AND SOCIAL PROGRAMS

• Character Education Program-
