Learning and Social Programs

Character Education Program-

Provided by our school counselors to help each child better understand him/herself in relation to abilities, interests, and goals, and to encourage academic, social and emotional growth.

English as a Second Language (ESOL)-

Provides instruction for students in grades K5-5 in Language Arts.

Math Intervention-

Provide support for students in grades 3-5 to increase math fact fluency.

Opportunities for Acceleration (OASIS)-

Full day academically accelerated program for identified gifted students in grades 3-5. It offers students a wide variety of educational experiences, including creative and critical thinking, problem-solving, and hands-on learning across the curriculum.

Response to Intervention (RTI)-

Targeted intervention provided to children for additional reading support for 1st-3rd students.

Family Supports-

We now have an interpreter, social worker, and mental health counselor on staff to meet the needs of our families
