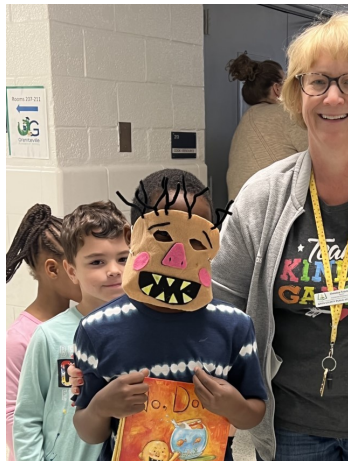


## Vision for Graniteville Elementary:

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## SIC Annual Goals

Due to the Covid 19 pandemic and protocols that prevented families from being physically involved in school activities, our SIC made it a priority to re-engage families during the 2021-2022 school year. 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## School Renewal Plan Goals

By Spring 2027, 69% of 3<sup>rd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade students will score Approaches, Meets, or Exceeds in ELA as measured by SC Ready.

By Spring 2027, 72.3% of 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade students will score Approaches, Meets, or Exceeds in Math as measured by SC Ready.

By Spring 2027, 18 out of 29 certified teachers will be GT Endorsed.

By Spring 2027, 69% of parents will indicate that they strongly agree that they are satisfied with school/home relations as measured by Title I Spring Survey data.
