### English Language Arts Goals

- 85% of students make typical growth on MAP Reading & MAP Math
- 75% of students score above the 50th percentile on MAP Reading & Math
- 75% of 3rd-5th grade students score “meets” or “exceeds” on SC Ready ELA and Math

### School Culture Goals

- Less than 10% of our students will serve an out-of-school suspension
- 100% of students on Tier III behavior plans improve behavior over time
- 100% of teachers use the MSEB behavior management system
