- Student Feedback Giving students real-time feedback, ensuring student mastery of objectives, adjusting instruction to meet student needs
- Explicit Social-Emotional Instruction 2nd Step implementation, Morning Meetings, Closing Circle, and 5th grade Advisory.

English Language Arts Goals


- 85% of students make typical growth on MAP Reading & MAP Math
- 75% of students score above the 50th percentile on MAP Reading & Math
- 75% of 3rd-5th grade students score "meets" or "exceeds" on SC Ready ELA and Math

School Culture Goals

- Less than 10% of our students will serve an out-of-school suspension
- 100% of students on Tier III behavior plans improve behavior over time
- 100% of teachers use the MSEB behavior management system

Below is our SC Ready Reading data from Spring of 2018 with the % Meeting and Exceeding SC Standards. We were proud that our students outperformed all students in North Charleston, but we know our students can keep growing! There is also our reading and math data for MAP from fall to winter 2018. We were excited to see the progress our students are making, but see that we need to continue to push our reading scores and work especially with our 1st-3rd graders.
