Keeping our children safe is always a priority at H.E. McCracken Middle School. The SIC conducts an annual safety walk with an extensive tour of the building and grounds to identify any existing or potential safety concerns. We were able to implement small and inexpensive safety measures immediately, while notifying the district office of any capital improvement needs. We also are in the process of installing speed bumps and redirecting traffic patterns to ensure we are maintaining distance and reducing hallway traffic.

Dismissal time was identified as a primary concern for safety during the 2019-2020 school year, with walkers, car riders, bus riders and activities occurring at the same time. Principal Skirtich created series of changes to the dismissal process including specific car and foot traffic paths and increased supervision as well as a video for our parents to explain the changes and dramatically improve the safety of our students.
