Report to the Parents

This year, Marlboro County School of Discovery, and Blenheim Elementary Middle School combined to form Blenheim Middle School of Discovery (BMSD). Our primary goal is to help every student acquire the 21st Century skills outlined in the Profile of a SC Graduate. The acquirement of these skills are extremely important before students' transition to college or careers. Another goal is to raise the academic achievement of all of our students through projectbased learning, integrating the arts, and literacy strategies across content areas. We continue to implement new instructional strategies to impact each student's individual learning styles and needs. BMSD teachers participate in professional development sessions throughout the school year. Sessions are developed and determined based upon data collected from various assessments, teacher surveys, observations, student needs, school-wide and district goals. We continue to embrace research-based instructional practices, character education, parent communication, data analysis, and the integration of technology and arts across all content areas. All of our students have been provided with a Chromebook. We will continue to fully integrate technology into our curriculum and instructional plans.

Blenheim Middle School of Discovery strives for excellence in the arts, athletics, and academics. We provide students the opportunity to participate in visual and performing arts through art, band, chorus, and dance. Our students perform in school and community events, as well as local and state competitions. We offer a STEM lab that helps prepare students for possible majors and careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics in the future.
