Lucy G. Beckham High School's fifth year has been one of growth in all areas-Academics, Arts, and Athletics! We are building upon the successes of our first years and have continued to excel. Our first and second SC State Department of Education report card rated LBHS as Excellent! We have built a culture of high expectations and focus on students that has established us as a top high school in the Lowcountry. We are embracing Beckham's new traditions and we are listening to each other through student-led programming and recognition of the importance of student voice in our school community. The Lucy G. Beckham High School Improvement Council (SIC) is also thriving. We include five parents and two teachers, elected by their peers for two-year terms, two student members from the Student Advisory Board, and four community members serving four-year terms (see page 4). Every public school in SC is required by law to have a SIC which hosts open meetings, adopts bylaws, develops school goals, and releases an annual report. Your SIC takes these responsibilities seriously. Not only have we met at least six times each year, usually on the last Thursday at 5 pm; we have also set lofty goals and are proud to share our school's successes and opportunities for improvement with you in this year's report.

What Makes LBHS Different?

CREW

Students are part of a family that is a learning community that supports and challenges one another. During CREW students work on building relationships, strengthening literacy, providing service, preparing for college and post-secondary careers, and exploring fitness opportunities.

FOCUS and One Lunch

Every student has time during the school day to work with student and teacher choice Focus sessions to make up work, get extra help or participate in clubs and activities. The entire school has lunch together throughout the building and this enables students and teachers to build relationships and participate in a productive break in the day.

Independent Learning Time (ILT)

Students have a 41-minute period of Independent Learning Time (ILT) built into their schedule each day for academic help, independent work, study groups and life balance. A more structured option (SLT) is also available.

Veterinary Science

This program explores essential concepts related to skills needed to pursue a career in Veterinary Medicine. Students learn animal sciences in a hands-on environment, working with a variety of animals in the classroom.







Building Construction

Students in this program receive practical training in the entire range of residential and light commercial building techniques, and complete multiple hands-on projects. Successful completion of the four-level program provides students with the opportunity to be eligible for industry-recognized certifications and credentials.

Coast Guard JROTC

The LBHS Coast Guard JROTC is the 1st in South Carolina. Thanks to our efforts and with legislative support, now any school that meets the requirements can apply to open a CGJROTC unit. Curriculum includes coursework on leadership, civics, health and wellness, Coast Guard operations and history, nautical science, and teamwork. With a STEM focus, cadets learn real world concepts and model leadership thorugh service and a committment to making LBHS the best it

can be.
