Lamar-Spaulding Elementary School is a newly formed school created from two existing schools in the area. The school is housed in a brand-new state-of -the-art building on a large parcel of land as you enter the beautiful Lamar area. The school is 84,000 square feet housing 33 classrooms, 2 project labs, music room with risers, art room with a kiln room, gym, cafeteria, stage area for performances, health clinic, guidance suite, and an office suite.

The school was built with safety in mind with secured entrances and security cameras. A full-time School Resource Officer (SRO) is employed through the Darlington County Sheriff's Department to aid in the safety and well-being of our students and staff.

Lamar-Spaulding Elementary opened in August 2020 in the midst of the pandemic. In order to follow safety protocols, varied opportunities to view the school and meet the teachers were provided on a YouTube channel, social media, and interactive conferencing platforms, and other outreach projects. We are excited to welcome volunteers, visitors, and community members to our school now that we are able to.

One of the greatest strengths of our school is the amazing community that we serve. The faculty and staff are dedicated to the success of the students of Lamar. We have seen great progress and our students are flourishing in the supportive environment.

Ash, the Kindness Fox, is a great example of the positive climate of our school. Ash visits a class each week and then they "sprinkle kindness like confetti" to another class the next week. The excitement and motivation that our students provide each other through this project is heart-warming and special.

Testing data is limited due to this being LSE's second year, but trends are showing an increase in student achievement. MAP was used to show growth from Fall to Winter. In ELA, there was a 9% increase in students scoring "meets expectations" and "exceeds expectations". In math, there was a 7% increase in students scoring "meets expectations" and "exceeds expectations". Spring MAP and state standardized scores will be analyzed and used for planning for our future.

- Professional Development for all content areas and technology occurs at the school and district level for LSE teachers.
- Exemplar lessons are demonstrated at the school level to teachers.
