Teacher/Administrator Quality

BMS will increase the percentage of teachers trained in traumainformed and culturally responsive/relevant teaching from 51% in 2018-19 to 57% in 2021-22 as evidenced by professional development certificates. In addition, the teacher attrition rate, indicated at 20% for 2020-21, will reduce from 30% to 28% or less in 2021-22.

By May of 2022, 71% of BMS staff will be trained in traumainformed and culturally responsive/relevant instruction as evidenced by training certificates and informal observations.

By May of 2022, 100% of BMS Professional Staff will have opportunities to participate in appropriate staff development designed to enhance student achievement as evidenced by the professional development calendar and documentation from mylearningplan.

School Climate

BMS earned a climate score in 2018-19 of 51%. The Indicator for School Quality on the School Report Card should have increased to 57% in 2021-2022.

Due to COVID, School Report Card is not yet available, so the following baseline has been established by an independent BMS Parent Input Survey administered in January 2021.

• By May of 2022, each indicator already noted or above will be maintained, and all other indicators will increase by .5 on the average rating.
