
Shining in the Arts...


- Our school received a Distinguished Arts Program grant, ABC Learning Loss funding, and achieved recertification and funding as an Arts in the Basic Curriculum School!
- Our Band and Orchestra participated in the Carowinds Festival of Music, performing for three nationallyrecognized musicians as judges. Our Gryphon Concert Band brought home an 'Excellent' plaque to add to our achievements! Our String Orchestra achieved a 'Good' rating!
- In October we held our First Annual Scream for STREAM community event, which showcased the arts, STEM, and literacy! The event, our first major community event post-COVID, drew a crowd of well over 1,000 people!
- One student was accepted into the filmmaking session of SC Governor's School for Arts & Humanities!
- We continue to have a significant number of students identified as Artistically Gifted/Talented. Ten students were identified this year!
- Nine students were accepted into All County Honor Band. Three students were accepted into the Region 4 Honor Band.
- Thanks to the efforts of Ms. Trimpey, we hosted Electrify Your Strings, an event that afforded orchestra students and staff from our entire district to meet, learn from and play in concert with Mark Wood of the Transiberian Orchestra!
- Directed by Ms. Barr, our Gryphons performed the musical *Aladdin*, *Jr*.! The auditioned cast was comprised of students in from all grade levels.

Points of Pride...

- Beaufort Middle School is the first Personalized Learning school in BCSD as defined by SCDE!
- This year, we expanded our STREAM Program to include additional music and STEM class offer-ings.
- One Beaufort Middle School student was chosen as "Student of the Month" at the district level this year.
- Four Beaufort Middle School Students were recognized as students of the month for the City of Beaufort.
- Three of our 8th-grade students were recognized as a South Carolina Junior Scholar.
- Our 6th grade teachers and students partnered with national nonprofit Educational Passages to build, outfit, and launch a 5.5-foot boat which was launched in the Gulf Stream in early April! The boat's GPS and other equipment will report important data as it sails the ocean!!
- Our entire school united to commemorate 9/11 by participating in a paper crane project, in which we endeavored to craft one origami paper crane to represent each victim lost to the tragic events of September 11, 2001. The cranes were displayed in two glass tower displays in our gallery.
