SIC Annual Goals

As outlined in the Dr. Rose H. Wilder Elementary School's School Renewal Plan, three goals were identified along with action steps for each. These goals and action steps are outlined below:

Goal 1: By the 2021-2022 school year, Dr. Rose H. Wilder Elementary School will increase the percentage of parents attending school conferences from a baseline of 85% to 100% as measured by parent surveys, sign-in sheets, parent workshops and PTO/SIC data.

Action Step: Incorporate the use of various technology resources to improving parent-school communication and to inform parents of their student's progress towards mastering the SC state standards as well as the strengths, weaknesses, and ways to assist their child at home.

Goal 2: By the 2021-2022 school year, St. Paul Elementary will increase the percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring meets and exceeds expectations in Math by 5-7 percentage points from the data of the previous year annually as measured by the SC Ready state assessment.

Action Step: Use Common Assessment Test Data, District Benchmark Test Data, MAP Test Data, and STAR Test Data (Fall, Winter and Spring) as progress monitoring tools to determine the strengths and weaknesses of our students thus allowing teachers to implement best practices to increase student achievement.

Goal 3: By the end of the 21-22 school year, Rose Wilder Elementary will assist all

classroom teachers in grades 3-5 with interpreting and analyzing varies types of student data to increase student achievement in the subject areas of Math and English Language Arts as measured by increased student achievement and growth on weekly common assessments, district benchmark exams, MAP test, STAR test, and state assessment exams. (SC Ready & SC PASS)

Action Step: Implementation of weekly Professional Learning Communities (PLC's), weekly lesson planning with the reading and instructional coaches, co-teaching with coaches, and professional development training for all instructional staff members.
