Instructional Program

HHIECC offers a balanced literacy program with a reading and writing workshop model. Components include mini lessons and read alouds, along with shared, guided and independent reading and writing. Students apply skills in individualized literacy centers. We follow a guided math model with the Ready Mathematics curriculum. Science, social studies, and health are addressed through curriculum units in kindergarten. We provide experiences in music, media, explorations, art, computer, and PE through our specialty area classes. Pre-kindergaren follows the Creative Curriculum model. Speech, occupational, and physical therapy services are provided for qualified students. Multiple Language specialists and bilingual liaisons support our students whose home language is not English.
