We have 111 qualifying pre-kindergarten students in 8 classes attending a full day pre-kindergarten program. There are 200 kindergarten students in 12 classrooms attending a full-day program. HHIECC has 3 special education classrooms. One Multilingual Learner Program teacher supports our kindergarten students. Reading intervention is provided by our reading interventionist and other supporting teachers and tutors.

Instructional Program

HHIECC offers a balanced literacy program with a reading and writing workshop model. Components include minilessons and read alouds, along with shared, guided, and independent reading and writing. Students apply skills in individualized literacy centers. We follow a guided math model with Ready mathematics curriculum. Science, social studies, and health are addressed through curriculum units in kindergarten. We provide experiences in music, media, explorations, art, computer, and PE through our specialty classes. Pre-kindergarten follows the Creative Curriculum model. Speech, occupational, and physical therapy services are provided for qualified students. Multiple Language specialists and bilingual liaisons support our students whose home language is not English.
