- 2010-11 Palmetto Silver Award for Achievement – Presented by the State of South Carolina Department of Education for the fourth year in a row.
 HHIESCA is one of only four BCSD schools to receive a Palmetto Gold or Silver Award for four years in a row.
- 2010 John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts School of Excellence in Arts Education Award from the South Carolina Alliance for Arts Education and the Kennedy Center Alliance for Arts Education Network for the second year in a row.
- Named as a Palmetto's Finest Award semifinalist by the South Carolina Association of School Administrators. This award includes a comprehensive review of the school's student achievement, culture, instructional programs, faculty and staff and school leadership.
- President's Council on Fitness, Sports and Nutrition and the President's Challenge administrators recognized HHIESCA as

a President's Challenge Demonstration Center based on the quality of our school's physical education program and our willingness to serve as a model for other schools in the state and throughout the nation for the next five years.

- Designated as a Bronze Level South Carolina Healthy School by the SC Dept. of Education and the SC Dept. of Health and Environmental Control.
- HHIESCA students designed ornaments for the South Carolina Christmas tree for the 2010 National Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony at the Ellipse in Washington, DC.
- The Korosi Vegetable & Herb Education Garden and the Butterfly Garden, supported by the Avid Gardeners of Hilton Head Plantation, won first place at the state level of the Garden Clubs of South Carolina and have proceeded to the National Level of competition.
- Pilar Kayser, fifth grade student, was named second place winner in a poster contest sponsored by BCSD's Foundation for Educational Excellence.
- Fourth Grader Sophia Kaup, placed second in the intermediate photography category at this year's state PTA *Reflections*

competition.

- Fifth grade student Lily Gallagher received the 2011 Daughters of the American Revolution, Captain William Hilton Chapter, Citizenship Award.
- 38 students or 25% of the fifth grade class were named Duke Talent Identification Scholars for scoring in the 95th percentile or above on state and/or local testing.
- 39 students or 24% of the fourth grade class were named Duke Talent Identification Scholars.
